He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples,


and God himself will be with them; he will wipe every tear from their eyes.




A READING FROM THE WORLD AROUND US.



Assembly It is right to offer thanks and praise.


PREFACE

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD


Pastor The bread we break is a sharing in the body of Christ.
