Greetings and peace,

As many of you are aware, the leadership of the United Proclamation of the Gospel was invited to participate in an ELCA conference which focused on emerging congregations, specifically newly

formed communities. This conference, which was held in Baltimore Maryland and had

approximately 500 people from across the ELCA was indeed powerful for our leadership. As we left this conference, there was a desire in our leadership to be viewed by the larger church (synod and ELCA) as One community of faith. In discussion with the synod and in reviewing our constitutions, we discovered that there is a way in which how we've been functioning for the past two years can be formalized by entering into a "Parish agreement" with one another.

The constitutions of Light of Christ Lutheran Church and St. Peter's Evangelical Lutheran Church allow for the formation of a "parish" in chapter 20. In order for each congregation to be

part of a "parish" there must be a congregational meeting in which the parish agreement is approved by voting members.

During our October 26, 2019 at the UPG leadership retreat, work was completed to create a "Parish Agreement" document. In the coming weeks, this document, along with the announcement of our annual congregational meetings to approve the 2020 Budget will be mailed to every household of the UPG. This will be the first opportunity in the two plus year existence of the UPG that every person in the UPG will have an opportunity to cast a vote on whether or not we would like our congregations to remain in relationship with one another.

A "no" vote during this process will effectively end

the UPG relationship in its current organization and structure. A "yes" vote during this process will allow the UPG to continue moving forward utilizing the visioning plan



which was approved in March 2018 in which one of the future hopes would be to create a new single community of faith. <u>Please take note that a "yes" vote to this parish arrangement does not allow anyone to sell, or disburse property, or unify financial assets without first having a called congregational meeting in which voting members approve such a movement.</u>

In reflecting on our 2+ years together, God has provided many wonderful and profound ministries to flourish within our midst. Our leadership is excited about the potential opportunities for continued develop of our vision and mission, but as always we would like to maintain a sense of transparency and desire to follow not only the Will of God in the process but to also honor and respect each of your thoughts and opinions.

We look forward to your thoughts on this topic and look forward to our future.

On October 6th, worshippers at Light of Christ experienced a unique service of praise and thanksgiving for all the years the Child Center provided young children with education in a Christian setting. Children and adults sang songs learned by preschool children to praise God's greatness and love. Voices of young and old rang out with the songs of praise. It reminded me of words from St. Augustine: "to sing is to pray twice." Our music expressed our thanks, our praise, and our love for God twice over.

Later that day I attended a celebration concert of music by groups from Bethlehem and Easton.

These singers and musicians presented a wide range of genres of music and yet community was created among those of us in the concert hall despite the diversity of the music. BETHLEHEM EMERGENCY SHELTER



The Bethlehem Emergency Shelter (BES) is one of the many missions with which the UPG has been actively involved. We have fulfilled many of the responsibilities that are required as volun-

teers, including registration of shelter guests, preparing and serving the evening meal, being an overnight chaperone and preparing and serving breakfast. This year there are a number of new opportunities available for volunteers and some changes that have been made in the daily operation of the shelter, the most significant being that showers will now be available for the guests if a male and female volunteer are present from 7-9:00 PM. Previously many of us have prepared food at home and rewarmed it at the shelter but another significant change is that all cooking must be done on site or in a commercial



kitchen such as the ones we have at St. Peter's and Light of Christ.

The UPG has partnered with Star of Bethlehem to provide coverage at the BES, with our congregation being responsible to provide a meal and volunteers on the 1st Tuesday of each month from December through April. Please prayerfully consider being a part of this very important mission to help our less fortunate brothers and sisters. It's a wonderful way to share our many blessings and to love others. Volunteer needs are:

I. Registration:

- 3 volunteers (I female/I male) 4:30-7:15 PM
- 2 volunteers (I female/I male) 7:15-10:00 PM
- 2. Dinner: Provide dinner for all shelter guests and staff in our commercial kitchen
- 3. Dinner volunteers:
 - 6-8 volunteers for serving/prep
 - 2-3 volunteers for dinner clean up
- 4. Shower volunteers: Provide 2 volunteers to help with showers from 7-9:00 PM (I female/I male)
- 5. Overnight chaperones: I male/I female from 9:00 PM—7:30 AM
- 6. Breakfast: Provide breakfast for all shelter guests (can be a continental breakfast)
- 7. Breakfast volunteers: Minimum 2 volunteers to prepare/serve/clean up breakfast

We cannot operate the shelter without both genders represented in combined staff and volunteers. Please prayerfully consider how you might be of

assistance. If you would like more information or are able to help, please contact Michel Lloyd or Kelly Cascario. Thank you in advance for your willingness to serve!


