to have arisen from the congregational letter shared in July of 2019 regarding the assessment of the weekly giving on our St. Peter's campus. The effort to try to be transparent with our com-



munity seems to have had an unanticipated result of many people within our community of faith assessing "what one campus possesses" vs "what the other campus possesses."

In response to this, I might suggest that neither campus "possesses" any monies. All the financial assets of the United Proclamation of the Gospel in

On behalf of the Staff at Northeast Community Center, formerly known as Northeast Ministry, thank you so much for your generous donation of food to our food pantry!

Marvine-Pembroke is home to over 2,000 residents, all of whom are at or below the poverty level. During the month of June, the pantry served 204 families, consisting of 262 adults, 218 children, and 111 senior citizens. There were 15 new families who accessed the pantry in June. Families accessing the pantry receive items such as canned goods and nonperishables, as well as refrigerated items such as fresh eggs, juice, produce and lunch meats.

We are so grateful for your continuous support! Thank you for believing in our mission. Your generosity truly makes a difference.


